Southwest Manufacturing Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Arkansas, located at Little Rock, Arkansas, and doing business at 14th and Bond Streets, Little Rock, Arkansas, has adopted and used the trademark shown in the accompanying drawing, for SMALL BOATS, ADAPTED FOR USE WITH OUTBOARD MOTORS, in Class 19, Vehicles, and presents herewith five specimens showing the trade-mark as actually used in connection with such goods, the trade-mark being applied to the goods by placing thereon a label or decalcomania on which the trade-mark is shown, and requests that the same be registered in the United States Patent Office on the Principal Register in accordance with the act of July 5, 1946.

The trade-mark was first used in October 1946, and first used in commerce among the several States which may lawfully be regulated by Congress in November, 1946.
